Study aim

Key to a successful colonoscopy is having a clean gut. The CLARITY Study is comparing two bowel cleansing drinks in young people:

- **PLENVU**[®] is commonly prescribed for people aged 18 and over, and is now being tested for use by children and teens under 18 years of age (meaning it is 'investigational' in this age group).
- Sodium picosulfate is commonly prescribed to children and teens in preparation for a colonoscopy.

This study aims to find out which one cleans the gut (colon) better, and which one is preferred by children and teens in terms of ease of use.



A **colonoscopy** is a medical procedure that allows a doctor to look inside your colon using a thin, flexible tube with a tiny camera on the end. The colon is the lower part of the bowel and is also known as the **gut**. To make sure the doctor has a clear view, your gut needs to be empty and clean. To achieve this, you must take a bowel cleansing drink before the procedure.

We are looking for people to join this study who:



Are 1–17 years of age.



Need a colonoscopy.



Weigh at least 10 kg (1 stone 8 lbs).

Study treatment

If the study is suitable for you and you agree to take part, you will be randomly assigned to one of two study treatment groups. Randomly means something that is decided by chance, like flipping a coin. Your parent/guardian may also need to give their consent for you to take part.

You will have an equal chance of receiving either study bowel cleansing drink.

Study tests

As well as the colonoscopy, during the study you will have various medical tests and assessments. These will take place at the study centre or via telephone. Some of these tests will include:



Physical examination, including measurement of height and weight.



Measurement of heart rate, blood pressure and body temperature.



Electrocardiogram – a machine records the rate and rhythm of your heartbeats through small sticky patches attached to the chest, arms and legs.



Collection of blood and urine samples for various health checks.



You will fill in a questionnaire about how the study bowel cleansing drink tasted and felt in your mouth.

Your choice

Taking part is voluntary. You do not have to take part. If you do join, you can withdraw at any time for any reason.
